For the last MCPO newsletter for this school year, we are excited to spotlight the largest group of staff so far. Let's hear it for the Resource and Life Skills Teachers and Aides! There are almost 20 teachers and aides in this group! We thank each of you for all you are doing to help our kids and to make Mountain Crest (MC) a great place to be!

Here is what Stacie Hofmeister shared with me about the difference between resourse and life skills: "The difference is the types of disabilities. Resource students typically have mild or moderate academic or health challenges that impact learning. These students need support and accommodations to access curriculum. They receive diplomas just like their peers and have high level of success academically. Life Skills students have more significant disabilities and need more support. These students often have peer tutors that accompany them to classes and help reinforce skills. They work on IEP goals and have access to many courses as well."

There are 5 Resource Teachers (they teach different subjects), 2 Life Skills Teachers, and 1 Speech Pathologist. Between these 8 teachers they have 77 years teaching experience.

When I asked these teachers and aides, "What was something they wished all the students at MC knew?", this is what they said:

"That they are valued and loved. Each kid matters!"

"Follow your dreams even if it will 'take a long time'. The time will pass away, and you may as well do what you are passionate about."


